### GOMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

Children will begin to interact with adults and peers in a language rich environment. They will also be encouraged to use talk to connect ideas, explain what is happening and anticipate what might happen next, recall and relive past experiences.



# LITEBAGY

This term the children will be focusing on 'The Ugly Duckling' and 'Elmer'. Children will be encouraged to listen and play alongside each other. Children will be developing their fine motor skills through showing control in holding and using resources such as jugs to pour, turning pages in books and using a range of mark making tools.



# P.E

Nursery children will be introduced to PE. Children will be developing their expressive movement through the topic of 'witches'. Children will explore space and how to use space safely. They will also be

using balance bikes to help with teaching how to balance and take corners.



### UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD

The children will be developing their knowledge and understanding of the world through exploring our environment and small world models. We will begin to learn about different celebrations from different religions. This term we will be discussing and exploring Halloween and what it entails.





### MATHS

The children will be learning how to recite number names in sequence through number rhymes and daily counting. They will also be focusing on learning to recognise numbers 1-5. Children will also learn how to represent numbers on fingers. They will be learning about basic 2D shapes
