

ENGLISH

This term children will be reading a fiction text called *The Genius of the Romans*. The children will complete a range of different style questions using their prediction, summarisation, inference and retrieving skills. In writing, the children will be writing a narrative, diary and non-chronological report. They will focus on the effect they want to have on the reader and what skills they would use to create this impact. Year 3 will also be focusing on handwriting this term making sure they are meeting handwriting expectations.



HUMANITIES

This term children will continue to learn about the history and structure of ancient Rome and the Roman Empire.

They will begin with looking at the founding of ancient Rome, the expansion of the Roman empire and how different Romans lived. The children will then learn and explore the process of Romanisation of Britain.



Heathfield PRIMARY SCHOOL

SCIENCE

This term, children will explore the phenomena of light through engaging activities like optical illusions and two-way mirrors. The focus will be on shadows, understanding how they are created, their shape, and how they change during the day. Children will conduct independent investigations, exploring shadow shape, size, and direction, and identifying patterns in their observations.



MATHS

This term, children will begin by learning about non-unit fractions. They will begin with identifying what a non-unit fraction is, how it can be represented and compared. Once this knowledge is secure, they will learn to add and subtract fractions. Finally, they will explore the properties of polygons, including parallel and perpendicular lines.

THE ARTS

This term in design and technology, children will study the purpose, structure, materials and design features of greenhouses. By gaining knowledge in these areas, they will be equipped to design and create their own mini greenhouses.



COMPUTING

This term, children will explore the art of creating portraits, starting with headshot photos and learning how to map out a face using Markup in Photos. They will practise tracing to enhance their sketching accuracy and experiment with various drawing styles to infuse their portraits with creativity and variety.



P.E

This term, children in 3G will be learning outdoor adventurous activities. In these sessions, pupils will develop their problem solving skills through tackling challenges. The children in 3B will be doing athletics developing their running, jumping and throwing.



MUSIC

This term, children will apply their knowledge of notes and recorders to compose original music, continuously improving their compositions too.

RE AND PSHE

This term, the children will learn about the significance of silence in reflection and the tranquillity of places of worship, while also developing an understanding of courage, confidence and hope. In PSHE, children will learn about the benefits of physical activity, including the importance of balance and impact.
