

ENGLISH

This term, children will continue reading *The Wolf Wilder* by Katherine Rundell. They will be applying a range of their reading skills (comprehension tasks), with a particular focus on the meaning of words in context. In writing, the children will be developing their writing skills through the context of newspaper reports, diary writing and balanced arguments.

We will also routinely work on relevant grammar & punctuation.



HUMANITIES

In the Frozen Kingdoms project, your child will learn about the regions of the Arctic and Antarctic. They will learn about the similarities and differences between these two regions, including the climate, landscape and natural resources. They will learn how to use grid references, lines of latitude and longitude, contour lines and symbols to identify the geographical locations of the Arctic and Antarctic, and how these, along with the tilt of the Earth, affect day length and warmth.

SCIENCE

In the Circulatory system project, your child will explore the role of the circulatory system and its main parts, carrying out research to answer their own questions. They will recap what they know about healthy eating and the Eatwell guide, exploring foods that fall outside the Eatwell plate and recommended daily amounts of foods. They will research the effects of smoking, alcohol and drugs on the human body.



MATHS

This term, children will learn by reviewing and building on their knowledge of area, perimeter and volume. They will also extend their knowledge of measurement and conversion. They will continue to look at reasoning and problem-solving questions as well as working on raw maths and fluency.



YEAR 6 SPRING TERM 2

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

This term, the children will be learning about remarkable engineers and significant bridges. They will be learning to identify and discuss the features, such as beam, arches and trusses. The project will lead to them designing and creating their own bridge prototypes.

This term, children will develop their coordination, strength, fitness and learn new skills through the topic of hockey. They should wear their full PE uniform to school on their PE day.

MUSIC
