In school we will be learning

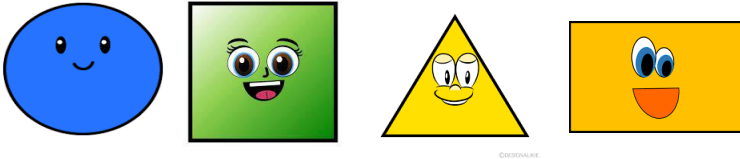
Counting and Exploring Shape

This term for maths, children will be learning to count to 5, using number names in order. They will also be exploring and naming 2D shape, such as circle, triangle, rectangle and square. Children will begin to understand prepositions 'on' and 'under'. They will explore simple patterns in the environment.



Shape Vehicles

Children in nursery will be exploring the project **Shape Vehicles** where they will go on a shape hunt around the nursery setting. Language related to shape will be modelled, for example, 'The wheels on the bikes are round, they are circles.' and 'The door has got four straight sides. It is a rectangle.' Children will begin to distinguish between different shapes, how they look and how the edges feel.



At home you can

- Go up the stairs and count each time you walk up. How many stairs are there? Did your child count in order? Did they miss any numbers?
- Go on a shape hunt around the house. Can you find circles? Squares? Rectangles? Triangles?

In school we will be learning

Children in nursery will be invited to listen to a range of stories that relate to their personal experiences and the season, Autumn. The texts are Pip and Posy the New Friend, My Mum, My Dad, Leaf Man, The Gruffalo and Lost and Found. Children will be learning Phonics Aspect 1, environmental sounds. Moreover, they will make marks on paper and give meaning to these marks. Nursery children will also begin to recognise their names.

Phonics Aspect 1?

Makes children more aware of the sounds around them and helps to develop listening skills.

Mark Making

Children will be introduced to projects which they will learn from and have fun with. For this project, children will play with shaving foam on a table or in a Tuff Tub. Children will listen to music and will be encouraged to make shapes in the foam in time to the music.



Other skills children will learn:

- To understand that print has meaning
- To hold books the correct way up and turn pages from front to back
- To be able to recall key events in stories read to them
- To be exposed to a variety of fiction, non-fiction, poetry and rhymes
- To give meanings to marks they make

At home you can

- Visit a park or the garden to find a collection of leaves and twigs with a grownup. Design your own leaf characters on the floor or on the paper.
- Go for a walk. What things do you hear as you walk? List the things you hear.

In school we will be learning

This term for communication and language, children will be learning a range of nursery rhymes or songs and join in with these. They will be able to follow simple instructions. They will also listen to stories read by an adult and learn why listening is important. They will become familiar with their teachers and begin to engage in back-and-forth conversations. Also, they will use talk in imaginative play. In conversation, they will be able to recall events which have already happened. Children will speak clearly, in a way that is understood by others.



Find a Friend

In this project, each child's face will be printed and displayed for other children to observe. Children will be invited to point out, describe and talk about their friends. Children in nursery will begin to learn that there are different ways to start a conversation, such as sharing thoughts or ideas with others.



At home you can

- Read a story with a grownup and talk about what you see in the pictures. Grownup to ask questions and encourage conversation about the story.
- Sing a nursery rhyme a day. Help your child get familiar with vocabulary in the rhymes.

In school we will be learning

Children will know about family structures and talk about who is part of their family. They will listen to a wide range of stories featuring different cultures, communities and traditions. Also, throughout the year they will learn about a variety of cultural celebrations including Christmas, Eid, Ramadhan, Easter, Valentine's day, Mother's day, Father's day, Chinese New Year and Diwali. Children will understand and use the language of today, tomorrow and yesterday in their talk. They will observe and talk about the daily weather, along with naming the four seasons. Children will understand sense and how to use language to describe them.



Tidy Team

For this project, children will observe pictures of untidy resources and will be asked what is wrong in the picture. They will understand why it is important to tidy up in nursery and why it is important to keep things clean. It will be explained to them what tidying means. Children will engage by talking about how they tidy up at home.



Tidy or untidy?

At home you can

- Encourage a routine of playing and tidying the toys away before moving on to the next set of toys. Reiterate that the room is 'untidy' and we need to make it 'tidy' again.
- Make a fruit bowl. Help your child to use their tasting sense to taste the fruit and describe how it tastes.

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Expressive art and design

In school we will be learning

For expressive art and design, children in nursery will recognise and name different colours. They will engage in messy play activities, such as water, shaving foam and cornflour. Children will create large scale and small-scale artwork using variety of tools such as paintbrushes, pencils, crayons, felt tips, paints, chalk and wax crayons. They will also use other tools such as scissors, rolling pins, glue, tape and crafting tools for a purpose. Children will begin to explore different techniques to join materials and will know how to use and transport scissors safely.



Familiar Rhymes

For this project, there will be daily nursery rhymes which children will join in and take part with words and actions. They will be encouraged to share a favourite nursery rhyme. Nursery rhyme picture cards will be used to support the children to select a favourite rhyme to sing.



Being expressive

Children will join in with dancing and ring games. They will sing a few familiar nursery rhymes. Children will be encouraged to be expressive and use realistic toys in pretend play. They will use costumes and resources to act out narratives.

At home you can

- Use tools at home to create a picture of your family. Include people who are special to you. You can experiment with painting the picture, using crayons or felt tips.
- Sing familiar nursery rhymes with friends/family. Act it out using actions learnt in nursery.

In school we will be learning

For PSED, children will listen to others when 1:1 or in small groups and start and continue a conversation with a friend. Children will separate from caregivers happily. They will recognise happy and sad emotions. Children will play alongside others. They will also learn importance of hygiene and attend the toilet independently, as well as washing hands with soap. They will learn to put on their coat with some support to fasten. Also, they will follow nursery routines in playing, snack time, tidying and going home/lunch. They will engage in imaginative play and show awareness of others during play. Children will gain confidence when speaking to adults and peers in the class. They will seek the support of an adult when it is needed.



Someone Special

For this project, children will talk about special people in their lives. They will be supported to talk about who is special to them and why. Children will decorate a heart using different collage materials and talk about who they are making the heart for and why. They will present this heart to someone special.



At home you can

- Encourage your child attend the toilet and wash hands daily. Remind them about clean and tidy and why it is important to stay clean.
- Make a card for a special friend you met in school this term. Add flowers, hearts, pictures. Give this to the friend when you see them next.

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Physical development

In school we will be learning

This term children will learn how to put their arms into a coat. They will use large scale movements with mark making materials, such as write dance. When sitting on the carpet, children will be able to cross their legs. Children will be able to eat with a spoon and fork. They will move safely in a space and be able to stop safely when there is an obstruction. Children will make marks using a dominant hand. They will also begin to fasten their buttons and zip up their coats. When mark making, children will begin to use anti-clockwise movements.



Friendship Rainbow

For this project, children will be provided with a large piece of paper for communal painting. They will squeeze ready mixed paint in red, yellow and blue in different areas of the paper. Children will use cars, paint rollers and brushes to make marks in the paint and talk about what happens to the paint when it mixes with one another. Children will begin to see new colours being formed.



At home you can

- Visit a local park and use the climbing frame to help develop physical development. You can also run, walk, crawl, skip and jump in the park.
- Make patterns on a large paper. Use circular motions and lots of colours.
