

#### FRIDAY COLLECTION TIMES


If your child finishes school on Fridays at 12:00, there is a slight change in gate closing times for you.


## RECEPTION TRIP

### SAFER INTERNET DAY AND RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL

Safer Internet Day is celebrated globally in February each year to promote the safe and positive use of digital technology for children and young people.

Safer Internet Day 2022 was celebrated on 8th February with the theme 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'.

The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child is all about ensuring the best possible childhood for every child and young person. All of the rights apply, all of the time, and this includes the time a child spends on the internet. This week's activities will explore the broad themes of Safer Internet Day with some of the activities linking to the right to relax and play (Article 31), protection from harm (Article 19) and to the importance of respect and dignity.

**Activities**: Draw a picture of your favourite online game or character. Discuss the sort of helpful message they might give to you and other children. You could add these to the pictures as speech bubbles.

Your right to be safe and protected is always important, including when you use computers, phones and the internet. Can you think of three top tips for staying safe online? Use thinkuknow.co.uk to help. Discuss this with the adults in your house.


Article 31 (leisure, play and culture): Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities.




### HERE'S WHAT WE GOT UP TO IN SCHOOL ON SAFER INTERNET DAY. . .



Year 4 created their own internet safety interactive guizzes on their iPads.


