ATTENDANCE AND LATENESS

We are aiming for 97%+ attendance for all of our pupils as this is what we, and the local authority consider is necessary for all pupils to reach their full potential. We understand that children do become unwell, however it is essential that you inform the school of any illness. If your child is going to be absent, please call the school on **each day of your child's absence by 9am**. Please call 0121 464 6474 and leave a message on the absence line. Include the child's full name, class and reason for their absence. Please tell us, where possible the nature of the illness. "Sick" or "unwell" does not provide us with enough information to be able to authorise an absence therefore the absence could remain unauthorised on your child's record.

There has also been a significant increase in the number of the children arriving late to school. Poor punctuality can result in missing a significant portion of the lesson as well as causing disruption to the teaching and learning of the class. It is essential that your child

arrives in school on time. The gates open at 8.35am and close again at 8.50am, please arrive between these times.

RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL

This week is Anti-Bullying Week which takes place across the UK from 15 to 19 November 2021. The children across school have been learning all about anti-bullying and the importance of being kind to everyone.



There are three articles that provide a particularly strong link this week. Please discuss these with your child;

Article 2 – Non-discrimination: The Convention applies to every child without

discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 12 – Respect for the views of the child: Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.

Article 19 – Protection from violence, abuse and neglect: Governments must do all they can to ensure that children are protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect and bad treatment by their parents or anyone else who looks after them.







Nursery and Y1 have been learning about kind hands and the importance of having kind hands.
















Year 5 and 6 created comic strips to tell a story of kindness and how One Kind Word can make a difference.
