GOVID- 19 BISK ASSESSMENT:

As a MAT we have been regularly reviewing government guidance and our risk assessments. This has included assessing any changes needed as we progress through the 'road-map'. Currently, the 21st June roadmap marker seems uncertain. This also falls quite late into our school year. As a result, we have decided to make no changes to the control measures in place. It is important to us that we keep as vigilant as possible with regards to the virus and new variants, reducing the risk to all, by maintaining our high standards.

The following control measures will therefore remain in place until we break up in July:

- Class bubbles (including lunchtimes)
- Regular handwashing
- Application of antibacterial hand gel at regular intervals across the day
- Mask wearing for adults on site during drop off and collection
- Mask wearing for staff in shared areas and on playground duty

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BIGHTS BESPECTING SCHOOL

This fortnight we are looking at World Refugee Day which has been recognised by the United Nations since 2001. A refugee is someone who has had to flee their home because their lives were in danger in their home country. World Refugee Day is on 20th June 2021 and helps to raise awareness of the lives and experiences of refugees.



This year's theme is 'Together we heal, learn and

shine.' On World Refugee Day Article 22 and Article 10 are particularly important:

Article 22 (refugee children)


If a child is seeking refugee or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.

Article 10 (family reunification)

Governments must respond quickly and sympathetically if a child or their parents apply to live together in the same country. If a child's parents live apart in different countries, the child has a right to visit and keep in contact with both of them.
