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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

This fortnight we have been busy in school as always but unfortunately we have had some confirmed cases in our school community which has meant the closure of

classes. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank the parents who have supported us throughout and ensured that their children have engaged with the remote learning offer that school can provide. I also wanted to clarify the situation around devices for home learning as we have had some requests from parents. The DfE will be providing schools with a very small number of devices and when our devices are allocated, they will be for families with the greatest need who are unable to fund a device themselves

We have now been notified that Birmingham will be in Tier 3 when lockdown ends and having attended the online meeting with Councillor Zaffar and Dr Justin Varney, it is clear that the Lozells / Handsworth area is facing particular challenges. We as a school will be doing everything we can to maintain the measures in place and will ask you to continue to do so in support. We have also committed to sharing key messages from Birmingham City Council with you. During the meeting Dr Varney and Councillor Zaffar explained that the city council has a number of support mechanisms for any families struggling and you can find more information at this link https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/info/50233/support for residents during the coronavirus covid-19

Next week we will be in contact with you about further support we can offer to those families that need it in preparation for the two week Christmas break. The Villa Foundation is also generously offering their support with hot meals over the break for families in need so please be assured we are here to help.



Below are the next two articles in the convention for you and your child to discuss this week:

Article 3: This is one of the most important articles in the UNCRC, and many other articles are related to it. It says that the interests of children and young people should be thought about at all levels of society, and that their rights should be respected by people in power. In other words, it says adults should think about the best interests of children and young people when making choices that affect them.

Article 4: Says the Scottish Government and UK Government should both work to make sure the convention on children's rights is known about and upheld. This means that they should always try to make sure that the rights of children and young people:

- Are realised in practice
- Active in helping children and young people to live safer and happier lives.

It also means that they should take steps so that children, young people and the adults who work with them all know about the UNCRC (United Nations Convention on the rights of the Child).
