HEADTEAGHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a fortnight it has been! It has been an incredibly busy time in school and the children are working very hard. We are making sure that they are doing lots of exciting

learning as well as focusing on the basic skills that they need to build upon for success this year. You will be receiving emails with the work to be done if the children are at home self-isolating—this matches with what the children are being taught in school so they don't fall behind and it means that it is really important that they complete it (unless they are unwell). So that it can be marked by the teacher, email it in to enquiry@heathfld.bham.sch.uk and it will be passed on to them.

We are encouraging children to follow the Heathfield Ways and display positive behaviours both in and out of the classroom and there are very few sanctions being applied currently, which is lovely. However one or two children are receiving reminders about their behaviour and we hope that the messages are reinforced at home as well as at school on these occasions.

Unfortunately, our Nursery has been closed for self-isolation for the last two weeks, but we look forward to welcoming the children back on Monday 12th October. I have been fortunate enough to see some of the home learning sessions being delivered by Mrs Patel and they have been lovely! It's nice to know that in the event of a year group closure, the learning will continue and the children have the opportunity to see and engage with their teachers.

Walk to School Week

We are working alongside the Living Streets organisation and will be joining in with a Five Day Walking Challenge on the week beginning the 19th October. You can find more information here https://www.livingstreets.org.uk/wtsw and if you live too far away for the children to walk the whole way, the idea is that you park a little further away than usual and walk for the last ten minutes of the journey. The fresh air and exercise that the children get from walking to school sets them up well for a day of learning.


OBSERVING SATELLITES
