screening check before the end of term and the results will be sent to the local authority. This is because the phonics screening check was cancelled for Year 1 pupils last year. Year 2 pupils who meet the expected standard in phonics this term will not be required to complete any further statutory assessments in phonics. Year 2 pupils who do not meet the expected standard will be expected to take the statutory check in June 2022, alongside Year 1 pupils.

As I'm sure you are aware, the government has provided schools with specific funding to help reduce the gaps in attainment caused by the Covid 19 pandemic. We are using this funding to provide support for a number of pupils in school through the form of additional tutoring, 1:1 or small group interventions, and additional learning resources for the children to use. If your child is receiving tutoring this term, you will have received a letter from school with more information. It is our intention that all children in school benefit from this funding in some way as we know that all children have been impacted.

#### **Christmas information**

If you would like to order a Christmas dinner for your child/ren on the 15th December, please let us know by the end of next week (Friday 10th December). We will be having class Christmas parties in the last week of school and will welcome your contributions, but I wanted to let you know, if you don't already, about Natasha's Law. This is a new law put in place in October 2021 to protect those with food allergies. This means that any food you send into school should have a label listing all of the ingredients.

There are a number of families making travel arrangements for the two week break and I would just like to take this opportunity to ask you to carefully check the requirements on return so as to minimise any absence for your children. Self isolation may mean that they could miss some school in January if they don't return in time —the return date for the children is Wednesday 5th January.

## RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL



"All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights."

### **Article 1, Universal Declaration of Human Rights**

On December 10<sup>th</sup> 2021, people across the world will be celebrating 'Human Rights Day'.

This year, Human Rights Day is focusing on how rights are the beginning of peace within societies, and a way to create a fairer society for future generations.

### What is Human Rights Day?

It celebrates the signing of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), adopted by the United Nations in 1948.

Thirty declarations were written to protect the rights of all people, everywhere.

Human Rights Day inspires everyone to speak up and take action to end discrimination in all of its forms whenever and wherever it happens. It is a day to reflect on what still needs to be done to make society fairer for everyone.

## How does this link to the Convention on the Rights of the child?

The United Nations has since adopted many legally binding international human rights treaties and agreements, including the Convention on the Rights of the Child. These treaties are used as a framework for discussing and applying human rights.
