## BIGUTS BESPECTING SCHOOL

The article we are looking at this fortnight is Article 15. You may like to discuss this with your child and complete the activities together.

Article 15 - freedom of association

Every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights. We can learn a lot from other children and young people that helps to form our views and opinions about different things. Joining together as a group, we can bring about change.

Key question: Why is important that young people should have the opportunity to meet, spend time together and share ideas?

Activity: Discuss what adults can do to help you enjoy your right to association. Not just teachers or parents, but think about all duty bearers in the wider community. What can you do to claim your right, relating to Article 15? Perhaps create two columns to capture your ideas for what adults as duty bearers can do and you - as the rights holders - can do.
