

REGEPTION SCHOOL PLACE APPLICATION DEADLINE

Children in Birmingham can start school (Reception) in the September after their fourth birthday. If your child is due to start Reception in September, you must complete the application form online at

https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/ info/20119/school_admissions/1786/ apply_for_reception_primary_school/4

If your child is at Heathfield Nursery, they DO NOT automatically get a place in Reception. ALL parents must apply online through Birmingham City Council. It is the council who decide which children are offered a place, depending on siblings in school, SEND, and distance of home address from school.

The deadline for competition of the application is 11:59pm on 15th January 2022.

The National offer day, when parents are informed which school their child has a place at, is on 19th April 2022.
