- How can you make your game easier/harder?

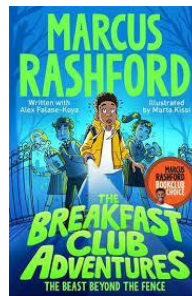


READING

In order to prepare for Year 5, it would be really helpful if you could focus on the following key areas:

- developing your knowledge of **division facts**. You need to be able to divide up to a 3 digit number by a one digit number. E.g. 125 divided by 5.

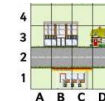

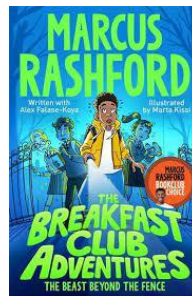

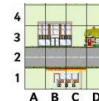
